Holiday Tour Trails :

You can choose from three circular walking routes:

Please follow the directional signs of the route you have chosen. All routes pass through the common activity complexes!

Short trail - "Etrog"

Length of the route: 1 km

- "Goren Haachim" – Hear the story of Neot Kedumim, the *Goren* (Threshing Floor) and how it operates is explained, learn about the harvest festival and the preparations for a new and different agricultural season.
- "The Agam (pond) Sukkah" - Discover the importance of water in ancient Israel and the different ways to store and preserve rainwater.
- "The Four Species Sukkah" - The four species are presented in the sukkah together with their symbolism and the special way in which they were "chosen".

Medium trail - "Hadas"

Length of the route: 1.5 km

- "Goren Ruth" – Hear the story of Neot Kedumim, the *Goren* (Threshing Floor) and how it operates is explained, learn about the harvest festival and the preparations for a new and different agricultural season.
- "Jebusite Cistern" (*Bor Yevussi*) – Discover the importance of water in ancient Israel and the different ways to store and preserve rainwater.
- "The Four Species Sukkah" - The four species are presented in the sukkah together with their symbolism and the special way in which they were "chosen".

Long trail - "Lulav"

Length of the route: 2 km (the route is not accessible for strollers)

- "Sukkat Hasharon" - Hear the story of Neot Kedumim and learn about the harvest festival and the preparations for a new and different agricultural season.
- "Lion's Cistern" (*Bor Ha'Ari*) - Discover the importance of water in ancient Israel and the different ways to store and preserve rainwater.
- "The Four Species Sukkah" - The four species are presented in the sukkah together with their symbolism and the special way in which they were "chosen".
